### **Invitations**

The FEI World Equestrian Games 2006 (FEI WEG) are open to National Federations (NFs) being a member of the Fédération Equestre Internationale (FEI).

National Federations, which have not declared their participation within the period stipulated, may only do so with the approval of the FEI and the OC.

### **Entries**

Entries must include the following information on horses: name of horse, colour, gender, birth year, country of birth, sire, sire dam, breed (stud book initials), present nationality, passport number, name(s) of owner(s) incl. complete address; horse and rider registration number.

**All entries must obligatorily be made via the online entry system (<http://login.hippobase.com>). Passwords to enter the system and further information will be sent to the respective NF after the entry in principle. The OC will not accept any other entries or incomplete entries.**

**1. Entries in Principle: Monday, 1st May, 2006**

Each NF must state whether they intend to participate with a team or only with individual competitors in each respective discipline.

**2. Nominated Entries:**

Detailed entries with all complete information required. According to GR Art. 121.8.2., the list of the Nominated Entry may consist of a higher number of competitors and horses than the Definite Entry, but in any case never more than double the number of the Definite Entry.

**CH-M-S / Jumping: Monday, 24th July, 2006**

Each NF may enter a maximum of 10 competitors and 20 horses.

**CH-M-D / Dressage: Monday, 17th July, 2006**

Each NF may enter a maximum of 8 competitors and 8 horses.

**CH-M-C / Eventing: Monday, 17th July, 2006**

Each NF may enter a maximum of 12 competitors and 12 horses.

**CH-M-A / Driving: Monday, 24th July, 2006**

Each NF may enter a maximum of 6 competitors and 30 horses.

**CH-M-E / Endurance: Monday, 17th July, 2006**

Each NF may enter a maximum of 10 competitors and 12 horses.

**CH-M-V / Vaulting: Monday, 17th July, 2006**

Each NF may enter a maximum of 7 female and 7 male vaulters plus 1 longeur and 1 horse per individual vaulter, and a maximum of 2 teams of 7 vaulters plus 1 longeur and 1 horse per team.

**CH-M-R / Reining: Monday, 24th July, 2006**

Each NF may enter a maximum of 8 competitors and 10 horses.

### 3. Certificate of Capability

Certificates of Capability must be sent (online) to the FEI and the OC at the latest by Monday, 24<sup>th</sup> July, 2006. Only those competitors and horses for which the FEI confirms a Certificate of Capability may compete. Qualification criteria are according to official FEI publications. For Vaulting only the vaulters have to qualify.

### 4. Definite Entries

The names of the competitors and horses actually starting must be indicated and selected from those competitors and horses on the Nominated Entry list.

**CH-M-S / Jumping: Tuesday, 22<sup>nd</sup> August, 2006, 18:00 h (CET)**

Each NF may enter a maximum of 5 competitors with 1 horse each (or up to 2 individual competitors with 1 horse each).

**CH-M-D / Dressage: Tuesday, 15<sup>th</sup> August, 2006, 18:00 h (CET)**

Each NF may enter a maximum of 4 competitors with 1 horse each (or up to 2 individual competitors with 1 horse each).

**CH-M-C / Eventing: Thursday, 17<sup>th</sup> August, 2006, 18:00 h (CET)**

Each NF may enter a maximum of 6 competitors with 1 horse each (or up to 2 individual competitors with 1 horse each).

**CH-M-A / Driving: Wednesday, 23<sup>rd</sup> August, 2006, 18:00 h (CET)**

Each NF may enter a maximum of 3 competitors with a maximum of 5 horses each (or 1 individual competitor with a maximum of 5 horses each).

**CH-M-E / Endurance: Monday, 14<sup>th</sup> August, 2006, 18:00 h (CET)**

Each NF may enter a maximum of 5 competitors and 6 horses (or up to 2 individual competitors with 1 horse each).

**CH-M-V / Vaulting: Thursday, 17<sup>th</sup> August, 2006, 18:00 h (CET)**

Each NF may enter a maximum of 3 female and 3 male vaulters plus 1 male and female reserve vaulter per NF, 1 longeur and 1 horse per individual vaulter, 1 horse and 1 reserve horse and 1 longeur and 1 reserve longeur per team consisting of 7 vaulters.

**CH-M-R / Reining: Friday, 25<sup>th</sup> August, 2006, 18:00 h (CET)**

Each NF may enter a maximum of 4 competitors and 5 horses (or up to 2 individual competitors with 1 horse each).

### 5. Substitutions

Competitors and horses entered on the list of nominated entries can be replaced and additions can be made within the limits specified in Art 121.7.2 until the date of definite entries. In the event of an accident or illness of a competitor and/or horse, substantiated by a certificate from an officially recognised doctor and/or veterinarian, between the date of definite entries and at the latest one hour before the first horse inspection, substitutions of competitors and/or horses can be made. Such substitutions must be taken from the updated list of nominated entries and require Ground Jury approval. For Eventing please also refer to Art. 510.4. For Endurance please also refer to Art. 828.3.

### 6. Entry Fees

The following entry fees must be paid by the respective NF for all horses declared with the definite entries, including reserve horses:

<b>CH-M-R / Reining:</b>	525 € per horse

This includes stabling and straw bedding (see also §11.).

Checks will not be accepted! Please be aware of the time needed to complete transactions. The Chefs de Mission are kindly requested to produce a copy of the receipt of payment for entry fees.

**7. No-Show Competitors**

Entry fees will not be reimbursed. In the case that a competitor who made his/her entry does not show up at the event, the OC will charge the concerned NF with all relevant costs, i.e. hotel accommodation, stabling, entry fees, etc.

## **General Conditions**

### **1. Rules for Participation**

For further information, see under the respective discipline.

2. As soon as NFs have presented their entries, all Chefs de Mission, Chefs d'Equipe, competitors, also on behalf of the horse owners, as well as their employees/grooms, representatives and accompaniments are obliged, from the moment of arrival on the show grounds, to acknowledge and keep within the rules of the official show schedule, to acknowledge and keep within the German Animal and Welfare Laws and Guidelines, and to behave according to the ethical principles in common practice. Violations will be dealt with by the respective Ground Jury or Appeal Committee. This is to be confirmed in writing upon receipt of the show pass.
3. As soon as NFs have presented their entries, all Chefs de Mission, Chefs d'Equipe, competitors, also on behalf of the horse owners, as well as their employees/grooms, representatives and accompaniments, are obliged, from the moment of arrival on the show grounds, to acknowledge and keep within the "Code of Conduct". Violation of this code will be dealt with by the respective Ground Jury or Appeal Committee, in accordance with the Rules and Regulations of the FEI.

### **Code of Conduct**

The Fédération Equestre Internationale (FEI) expects all those involved in international equestrian sport to adhere to the FEI's Code of Conduct and to acknowledge and accept that at all times the welfare of the horse must be paramount and must never be subordinated to competitive or commercial influences.

1. At all stages during the preparation and training of competition horses, welfare must take precedence over all other demands. This includes good horse management, training methods, farriery and tack, and transportation.
  2. Horses and competitors must be fit, competent and in good health before they are allowed to compete. This encompasses medication use, surgical procedures that threaten welfare or safety, pregnancy in mares and the misuse of aids.
  3. Events must not prejudice horse welfare. This involves paying careful attention to the competition areas, ground surfaces, weather conditions, stabling, site safety and fitness of the horse for onward travel after the event.
  4. Every effort must be made to ensure that horses receive proper attention after they have competed and that they are treated humanely when their competition careers are over. This covers proper veterinary care, competition injuries, euthanasia and retirement.
  5. The FEI urges all involved with the sport to attain the highest levels of education in their areas of expertise.
4. The OC reserves the right, to make use of all illustrations (photographs, images, videos, etc.) made on behalf of the OC during the event or on the show grounds for their own commercial purposes, without explicit consent of the person/competitor illustrated.

## Special Rules

1. **Declaration of the horses and draw for order of starting**

See under the respective discipline.

2. **Venue**

The FEI WEG will take place on the grounds of the ALRV. The Endurance track will lead through Germany / Belgium / Netherlands.

3. **Practice arenas and practice obstacles** will be available to competitors on the competition site acc. to a time table. Riding, driving, vaulting outside these arenas is not permitted. The training areas are controlled by stewards. Dimensions of the training areas:

4. **Size of the competition arenas and length of the courses:**

5. **Liability**

The OC declines any liability for property or pecuniary damage which may happen to visitors, competitors, grooms and horse owners through slight negligence of the OC, his delegates or his assistants. The OC also declines any liability for theft, fire or other incidents.

By making the definite entries each competitor declares that he/she has taken notice of the schedule and the exclusion of the liability as set out in the schedule and that the competitor explicitly agrees therewith.

6. **Insurance**

All Chefs de Mission, Chefs d'Equipe, competitors, owners, trainers, team veterinarians and their accompaniments are personally responsible for damages to third persons caused by themselves, their employees/grooms, their agents or their horses. They are therefore strongly advised to take out a third-party insurance providing full coverage for participation in equestrian events at home and abroad, and to keep the policy up to date. The OC/FEI will **NOT** be responsible for any damage caused by competitors, their horses, owners, NF officials, their employees/grooms or their representatives.

The horses competing in the Jumping Final are insured on standard conditions, death and loss of use, for € 1 million per horse. This policy is a partial insurance coverage for these horses. If the owners wish to have their horses covered for a greater sum they should take out an additional insurance policy themselves.

7. **Medical, physiotherapeutic and veterinary services as well as the service of a farrier** are available during the show at the competitors own expense. Further information is available at the entry office.

8. **Veterinary Aspects** acc. to the Veterinary Regulations, 10<sup>th</sup> Edition, 2006

8.1. **Veterinary Examinations, Horse Inspections and Passport Controls**

will be carried out in accordance with the Veterinary Regulations Art. 1011; the Rules for Jumping Events, Annex VII; the Rules for Dressage Events, Annex I, the Rules for Eventing Events, Art. 518, the Rules for Driving Events, Art. 922, the Rules for Endurance Events, Art. 831, the Rules for Vaulting Events, Art. 717/718 and the Rules for Reining Events, Art. 312/314.

**General Regulations 21<sup>st</sup> Edition 2005 and any subsequent amendments will apply, acc. to Art. 139.1.**

- Dressage: 21<sup>st</sup> August, 2006
- Driving: 29<sup>th</sup> August, 2006
- Eventing: 23<sup>rd</sup> August, 2006 (1<sup>st</sup> Inspection)
- Vaulting: 23<sup>rd</sup> August, 2006
- Endurance: 20<sup>th</sup> August, 2006
- Reining: 31<sup>st</sup> August, 2006

Persons allowed in the area where the horse inspections take place according to Vet. Regs. §1011.

8.3. **Equine Influenza Vaccination (Vet. Regs. Annex VI)**

All horses and ponies for whom an FEI-Passport or a National Passport approved by the FEI has been issued must have the vaccination section endorsed by a veterinarian, who is not the owner of the animal, stating that it has received two injections for primary vaccination against equine influenza, given between 1 month and 3 months apart. In addition, a booster injection must be recorded as having been given within each succeeding 6 months subsequent to the second injection of the primary vaccination. None of these injections must have been given within the preceding 7 days including the day of the competition or of entry into the competition stables. The above are the minimum requirements for influenza vaccination. Both primary and first and subsequent booster injections should be given according to the manufacturer's instructions which will fall within the stipulation of the FEI ruling.

8.4. **Sampling for Prohibited Substances (Vet. Regs. Chap. V & VI and Annex III)**

FEI Championships and Games are subject to regular sampling, while they are recommended for other CIs. Special guidelines are applicable for events covered by the FEI's Medication Control Program (Groups I and II only).

8.5. **Medication Control Program (MCP)**

The competitors will be charged a fee of 8.50 € (□ 12.50 Sfr.) per horse toward the costs of the above program. This fee will be deducted by the administration office at the settlement of accounts.

8.6. **Approved Laboratory (Art. 1022 and Annex II)**

Under the Medication Control Program (MCP), all samples collected (blood and urine) in accordance with VR Art. 1017.1 will be analysed by the

## 8.7. Health Certificates

At the time of the first examination, i.e. upon arrival of the horses on the show grounds and before entering the stables, every competitor is obliged to have on hand the health certificates which are required for the transport to the event (see also § 8.e):

- i) if the competitor comes from an EU member country, a health certificate for registered equidae according to the specimen of annex B of directive 90/426 EEC in the current valid issue;
- ii) if the competitor comes from a non-EU country, a health certificate for registered equidae according to the specimen of annex II of the decision of the Commission 92/260 in the current valid issue.

The certificate must be issued in at least one official language of the country of destination and in one official language of the member country. The competitor must carry with him the original certificate, not a copy.

Horse passport and veterinary documents - including the health certificate for horses from foreign countries - are to be submitted to the official show veterinarian immediately after the arrival of the horses on the show grounds. These documents will also be handed back at the office of the official veterinarian - after payment of all expenses.

The organiser sees to it that on the competition site, an official state veterinarian is present to issue the health certificates which are necessary for the transport of the horses to their destination abroad.

**14.4. Accommodation for Grooms**

- e) The OC will charge 35 € per day for grooms staying longer than the free of charge period of their competitors/teams. Previous payment will be required.
- f) A security deposit of 25€ per room key will be requested.

#### 14.5. **Hotel Accommodation for Additional Officials / Non-Team Members**

- a) Limited accommodation at the expense of the NF or at one's own will be provided for persons other than those belonging to the official team, ex. veterinarians, medical doctors, physiotherapists, psychologists, black smiths, etc. Fulfilment of such requests depends on the availability of accommodation. Previous payment at one's own expense directly to the hotel will be required.
- b) However, it will not always be possible to accommodate these persons in the same hotel as the official team members.
- c) Earliest arrival and latest departure dates according to the dates specified for the official team members.
- d) Such requests must be received by the OC as early as possible and at the latest according to the declaration deadlines.

#### 14.6. **Declarations**

- a) All reservations as stated above (§14.1.) will be made through the Verkehrsverein Bad Aachen e.V. (VVA / Aachen Tourist Office) on behalf of the OC.
- b) The OC must receive the declarations (number of rooms for team members, number of rooms for additional officials, type of rooms, arrival date, departure date) for this purpose according to the following declaration deadlines:

#### 14.7. **General Conditions**

- a) For accommodation provided free of charge by the OC, the OC will only cover the room expenses if the room is personally used by the persons as stated under §14.1. and §14.4.
- b) Everyone must pay any additional costs (phone, mini-bar, parking, etc.) directly to the hotel before departure. Therefore, all guests (including those staying at the expense of the OC) must present their credit card upon checking in at their hotel.
- c) Earliest arrival check-in and latest departure check-out will be communicated with the official accommodation confirmation from the OC to the National Federation.
- d) Anyone needing accommodation before or after the period free of charge as stated above can request this through the Aachen Tourist Service (see §14.8) within the above stated declaration dates. Fulfilment of such requests depends on the availability of accommodation. Previous payment at one's own expense directly to the hotel will be required.
- e) Competitors not wishing to make use of the hotel reservation as made by the OC will receive no total or partial reimbursement for unused accommodation.
- f) The OC will charge the concerned National Federation with all relevant costs (ex. cancellation and no-show fees) involved for anyone, for whom the OC has made reservations according to their request received with the nominated entry, deciding to stay in another hotel, or who does not accept the rules of the assigned accommodation, and there will be no refund of any advanced payments.

#### 17. **Shuttle-Service:**

A Shuttle-Service for Chefs de Mission, Chefs d'Equipe and competitors from the airport (Cologne/Bonn, Duesseldorf, Maastricht-Aachen Airport/NED, Brussels/BEL and Liège/BEL) or from the hotel to the show grounds and back will be provided from Saturday, August 19<sup>th</sup> until Monday, September 4<sup>th</sup>, 2006.

#### 18. **Parking Passes**

Each team/discipline (i.e. not individuals) will receive 1 parking pass for the duration of the relevant discipline for a parking area near the show grounds.

Each Endurance competitor will receive 1 parking pass for the competition day for a parking area near the Vet-Gates.

#### 19. **Reimbursement of Travelling and Transportation Expenses:**

According to RG Art. 132, the OC will pay a lump sum for the travelling and transportation expenses of Chefs de Mission (under the condition that the NF actually participates in 3 or more disciplines), Chefs d'Equipe (only for teams), team and individual competitors and their grooms, and of the horses, including all costs of loading and unloading as well as customs and/or veterinary fees in the host country: For Jumping, Dressage, Eventing, Endurance, Vaulting and Reining the OC will pay a lump sum of 60 € based on the number of horses of each NF. For Driving the OC will pay a lump sum of 120 € per competitor.

The reimbursement of transport expenses follows under the condition of participation in at least one championship competition.

#### 20. **Settlement of accounts per competitor.**

**Reimbursement of prize money, transport and travelling expenses** will be paid out by **bank transfer** only to the respective NFs by September 15<sup>th</sup>, 2006. For this purpose the NFs are requested to state their bank information (name of recipient, bank name, bank code, account number, IBAN and BIC codes) together with their online entries. The NFs will receive receipts for the settlement of accounts per competitor by regular mail.

The OC is authorised to deduct any possible outstanding duties from the payment. Each NF is obliged to cover any outstanding expenses. Each NF is obliged to forward the prize-money to the person responsible.

21. **Taxation of Foreign Horse Owners, Competitors and Grooms:**

According to § 50a - Abs. 4 EStG of the German Tax Rights the OC must detain tax from all accounts paid out to foreign horse owners, competitors and grooms. Therefore, the total amount of tax payable will be deducted from prize money, reimbursement of transport, travelling, hotel, feed and bedding charges by the administration office at the settlement of accounts. The horse owners and competitors can apply for exemption of these taxes at the German Federal Office of Finances, if the lawful requirements are met: Bundesamt der Finanzen, Friedhofstraße 1, 53225 Bonn 3, Germany, phone: (49) 228-4060, fax: (49) 228-4062661. An exemption of these taxes is only possible if the appropriate certificate is submitted. Subject to change.

22. **Protests acc. to Art. 167**

Each protest must be made and signed by the Chef d'Equipe or persons responsible and be forwarded within the time prescribed. At the same time a sum equivalent to 100 € (≈ 150 Sfr.) must be deposited with the objection.

23. **Event-Organisation** (GR Art. 114 and 115)

In exceptional circumstances, with the approval of the Chefs de Mission, Chefs d'Equipe and the Ground Jury, the OC reserves the right to modify the schedule in order to clarify any matters arising from an omission or due to unforeseen circumstances. Any such changes must be notified to all competitors and officials as soon as possible and they must be reported to the Secretary General of the FEI by the Foreign Judge.

24. **Cancellation of the Event**

If special circumstances demand it, the OC reserves the right to take all necessary actions including the cancellation of the event by repaying the entry fee, with the approval of the FEI.

25. **Sponsor-Logo**

The OC authorises the competitors to carry the "Logo" of their personal sponsor on their clothing, saddle cloth or carriage (Art. 136.1.2. GR 21<sup>st</sup> Edition 2005), **except in the team competitions. In the team competitions only the national logo and the sponsor logo of the national team are permitted.** The Chief Steward is responsible for ensuring that FEI Regulations relating to Art. 136 are respected by competitors before entering the arena. Competitors not complying with Art. 136 will not be permitted to enter the arena during the competition.

26. **FEI WEG-Logo**

The NFs, team officials and competitors may not in any way use the FEI WEG-logo.

27. **Competitors, whose horses leave the show grounds without special permission of the OC during the FEI WEG - after the first horse inspection until one half hour after the announcement of the results of the last competition - will be disqualified.**

28. **Horse Lorries**

Only a strictly limited number of horse lorries of the competitors can be parked on or near the show grounds for the duration of the respective discipline (acc. § 10), provided the OC has received a request prior to the closing date of the definite entry. Only the assigned place may be used without fail. Electricity is supplied through installations at the assigned place. Cable is to be supplied by the owner of the lorry.

29. **Stable Security**  
The following security regulations of the Fire Department must be obeyed:
- Smoking is strictly prohibited in the entire stable area.
  - Open fires (e.g. camping stoves) are strictly prohibited.
  - Only the actually needed amount of feed supplies may be stored in the stables.
  - Open space and entry ways between the stables may not be obstructed by trucks or lorries.
- Those who disregard the above security regulations will be reprimanded by the OC accordingly.
30. **DOGS ARE STRICTLY PROHIBITED ON THE ENTIRE SHOW GROUNDS AS WELL AS ON THE CROSS COUNTRY, MARATHON AND ENDURANCE COURSES.**
31. **Ceremonies, Interviews**  
**Obligations connected with the declaration of the definite entries:**
- 31.1. **Opening Ceremony**  
All Chefs de Mission, Chefs d'Equipe, teams and individual competitors of the disciplines Dressage, Endurance and Vaulting as well as all German competitors obligate themselves to take part at the Opening Ceremony on Sunday, 20<sup>th</sup> August, 2006. However, all other competitors and team officials are kindly invited to attend this ceremony at their own expense.
- 31.2. **Closing Ceremony**  
All teams and individual competitors (without horses) of the disciplines Jumping and Reining obligate themselves to take part at the Closing Ceremony on Sunday, 3<sup>rd</sup> September, 2006. However, all other competitors and team officials are kindly invited to attend this ceremony at their own expense.
- 31.3. **Closing Ceremony / Parade / Champions' Dinner**  
All individual gold medallists (without horses) obligate themselves to take part at the Closing Ceremony including the following parade from the show grounds to the city centre of Aachen, as well as to attend the "Champions' Dinner" in the City Hall of Aachen on Sunday evening, 3<sup>rd</sup> September, 2006.
- 31.4. **Medal and Prize-Giving Ceremonies**  
The medal ceremonies for the FEI World Championships will take place immediately following each competition (except Endurance and Vaulting) and will include only the medal winners (except the Jumping Final: all 4 finalists) with their winning horses including the lap of honour.
- The prize-giving ceremonies for non-medal competitions will take place immediately following each competition according to the time-schedule.
- Detailed information regarding these ceremonies will be communicated to the NFs.
- 31.5. **Additional Presenting Ceremonies**  
All medallists (individuals and teams; with their relevant horses) obligate themselves to take part at the official medal ceremonies. Following the official prize-giving ceremonies, the OC on behalf of the City Mayor of Aachen requests that all medallists (individuals and teams) take part at additional presenting ceremonies in the City of Aachen (acc. to schedule).
- 31.6. **Interviews & Autograph Sessions**  
All Chefs de Mission, Chefs d'Equipe, competitors, team officials and especially medallists and placed riders must be available for interviews and autograph sessions when requested by the OC.
32. **Kiss & Cry Areas**  
Each Stadium has a so-called "Kiss & Cry" area to which a maximum of 4 persons pertaining to the relevant competitor currently in the arena will be allowed.
33. **No motorised carriages, motorbikes, bicycles etc. are allowed on the entire show grounds.**

34. **Working Room**

The OC will provide one working room for all Chefs de Mission.

### General Conditions

This CH-M-R is organised in accordance with the FEI Statutes, 21<sup>st</sup> Edition April 2004, FEI General Regulations, 21<sup>st</sup> Edition 2005, FEI Veterinary Regulations, 10<sup>th</sup> Edition 2006, FEI Rules for Reining Events, 2<sup>nd</sup> Edition 2005, and all subsequent corrections and modifications to the above Rules and Regulations as published by the FEI, the provisions of which shall take precedence.

An arbitration procedure is provided for under the FEI Statutes and General Regulations as referred to above. In accordance with this procedure, any appeal against a decision rendered by the FEI or its official bodies must be settled exclusively by the „Court of Arbitration for Sport” (CAS) in Lausanne, Switzerland.

### Conditions of Participation

- a) **Teams (Art. 305.2):**  
Each admitted nation may send a maximum of 4 competitors with 5 horses.
- b) **Individual Competitors instead of teams:**  
A nation which cannot send a team (at least 3 competitors/horses) may send a maximum of 2 individual competitors with 1 horse each.
- c) **Age of horses:** at least 6 years old
- d) **Qualification Criteria:** acc. to the official FEI publications.

### Special Rules

Chefs d'Equipe must declare in writing at the entry office **at the latest 90 minutes after first horse inspection on Thursday, 31<sup>st</sup> August, 2006**, the members of their team and the names of the horses actually starting. The same applies to individual competitors.


