FOR THE WELFARE OF THE HORSE**

The Fédération Equestre Internationale (FEI) expects all those involved in international equestrian sport to adhere to the FEI's Code of Conduct and to acknowledge and accept that at all times the welfare of the horse must be paramount and must never be subordinated to competitive or commercial influences.

1. At all stages during the preparation and training of competition horses, welfare must take precedence over all other demands. This includes good horse management, training methods, farriery and tack, and transportation.
2. Horses and competitors must be fit, competent and in good health before they are allowed to compete. This encompasses medication use, surgical procedures that threaten welfare or safety, pregnancy in mares and the misuse of aids.
3. Events must not prejudice horse welfare. This involves paying careful attention to the competition areas, ground surfaces, weather conditions, stabling, site safety and fitness of the horse for onward travel after the event.
4. Every effort must be made to ensure that horses receive proper attention after they have competed and that they are treated humanely when their competition careers are over. This covers proper veterinary care, competition injuries, euthanasia and retirement.
5. The FEI urges all involved with the sport to attain the highest levels of education in their areas of expertise.

*All owners and competitors are personally responsible for damages to third parties caused by themselves, their employees, their agents or their horses. They are therefore strongly advised to take out third-party insurance providing full coverage for participation in equestrian events at home and abroad, and to keep the policy up to date. All competitors start at their own risk.*

**The OC requires that all foreign competitors certify in writing( with a valid copy or a certificate in German or English), stating that the horse(s) has/have third party accident insurance and that this is valid for incidents that could occur in Germany. Competitors that cannot show such a certificate will be compulsorily insured at a cost of 15,00 € per horse for the above competition(s). The 15,00 € fee will be charged with the fees for nominated entries for the above competitions. These horses then have a valid accident insurance for the above competitions. Entries will not be accepted without the relevant confirmation of accident insurance or the extra payment of 15,00 € at the time of nominated entries**
